<p><b>No. 1 Constitutional Amendment Article VII, Section 4; Article XII, Section 42</b></p> <p><b>Limitation on the Assessment of Real Property Used for Residential Purposes</b></p> <p>Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution, effective January 1, 2023, to authorize the Legislature, by general law, to prohibit the consideration of any change or improvement made to real property used for residential purposes to improve the property's resistance to flood damage in determining the assessed value of such property for ad valorem taxation purposes.</p> <p>Yes No</p>	<p><b>No. 2 Constitutional Amendment, Article II, Section 5; Article XI, Sections 2 and 5</b></p> <p><b>Abolishing the Constitution Revision Commission</b></p> <p>Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to abolish the Constitution Revision Commission, which meets at 20-year intervals and is scheduled to next convene in 2037, as a method of submitting proposed amendments or revisions to the State Constitution to electors of the state for approval. This amendment does not affect the ability to revise or amend the State Constitution through citizen initiative, constitutional convention, the Taxation and Budget Reform Commission, or legislative joint resolution.</p> <p>Yes No</p>	<p><b>No. 3 Constitutional Amendment Article VII, Section 6; Article XII</b></p> <p><b>Additional Homestead Property Tax Exemption for Specified Critical Public Services Workforce</b></p> <p>Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to authorize the Legislature, by general law, to grant an additional homestead tax exemption for nonschool levies of up to \$50,000 of the assessed value of homestead property owned by classroom teachers, law enforcement officers, correctional officers, firefighters, emergency medical technicians, paramedics, child welfare services professionals, active duty members of the United States Armed Forces, and Florida National Guard members.
